Finally, their prayers were answered, when she discovered that she was expecting. Two months into her pregnancy, she miscarried one of the twins she was carrying.

Being a nurse, she knew the risks of this pregnancy were high. At 28 weeks, she went into

early labor and delivered a little girl weighing only two pounds. Their little miracle.

In the weeks that followed they nearly lost her several times. Once she flatlined, but they were able to revive her.

As well as needing two blood transfusions because of complications, the doctors detected a heart murmur. They thought she had a heart defect and maybe even brain damage because of such an early birth. Premature babies can have many birth defects such as hearing loss, blindness, growth defects, heart problems, and major organ problems.

Today, Gabrielle is the healthiest child in her age group. The doctors at the hospital for premature children are amazed at how well she is doing. She has absolutely no birth defects. Gabrielle attends our church and is a beautiful and vibrant young girl.

She has been brought up being called the miracle child by her parents and many others. Her mom says, "One day she will understand what this truly means."

"Behold, children are a heritage from the LORD, The fruit of the womb is a reward" (Psalm 127:3)

My son is now an adult and living on his own. He has decided to spread his wings and is making his own way. But I dedicated him to God when he was a baby and I trust that God will protect my son. There's not a special formula required to "get" a miracle; although faith, prayer, and more prayer help so much. I will continue to trust God and I know there are many more miracles in store for me. Yes. I do still believe in miracles.

#### **Missions and Miracles**

He is as close as the mention of His name...Jesus. We have all sung that song sometime in our lives. But it became such a reality to us during our 20 years as missionaries in El Salvador.

We arrived in El Salvador in 1980 during a civil war that lasted 12 years. It seemed like everything that could happen, did.

I became very sick during that first year. I came down with typhoid fever, malaria, and hepatitis all right in a row. Bro. Scism called my husband to tell him that I should come back to the US to see a doctor as I was very, very sick. We arrived in Jackson, Mississippi, and I went to see the doctor. After he saw all my test results, he told us that I would have to be in the hospital at least three months!! But what he didn't know was that we had been praying for my healing. The doctor took more blood samples, and he sent me a letter saying that all my tests came back clear. All he could say was that Jesus had healed me!!

One day our oldest two children, Jared and Leah, who at that time were seven and five years old, were at their Salvadorian grandmother's house, Sis. Santos. Remember, we were in a civil war. There was a knock at the door, and some terrorists came in looking for someone. They searched the whole house, looked directly at Jared and Leah, and left not finding the person they were looking for. The miracle here was, at that time, the leftists hated North Americans and were kidnapping them for ransom. They looked at our kids and did not realize there were white North Americans. God had turned them into Salvadorians!!

One evening we were on our way to Guatemala City. As we came near the border, we rounded a bend and saw a barricade of large boulders. There was no way around them nor a way to go over them, and my husband didn't have time to stop. I closed my eyes waiting to

hear the sound of the car hitting the rocks. We screamed, "Jesus!" And I waited and waited, and when I opened my eyes, we were on the other side of those boulders, and we made our way to the border. He is a miracle worker!!

We saw people raised from the dead, blind eyes opened, deaf ears opened, tumors disappear, people come out of wheelchairs. Really there were so many miracles in our 20 years there that I don't have space tell it all. But the greatest miracle of all is the thousands that received the Holy Ghost and were baptized in Jesus Name. God is so faithful, and he is still in the miracle business.


