How do You Smell?

"On November 13, 2000, the Portland newspaper, the Oregonian, posted a small excerpt that read as follows: "When a man robbed a bank in San Diego, the only thing about him that the teller could remember was his awful body odor. Apparently, that was enough. After police broadcast the information, a motel owner, alerted by the man's BO, called police, and the man was arrested."

Every human being has a certain scent. Our human scent is like an invisible liquid that continually pours off us. Wherever you go, that scent drops from your body leaving a trail. That is why dogs can successfully track people. If they can smell a garment that the person wore, the scent is on the garment. If they can find that scent on the ground,

their trail begins, and they can follow wherever the person walked.

Every family has a *family smell*. You can't smell your own, but others walking into your home will experience your family smell. Jesus has a family smell. His smell was brokenness, love, compassion, empathy. He traversed His world and left His mark wherever He walked.

If we want to be identified with the *smell* of Jesus, we must be broken. The outer shell of self-centeredness, selfishness and worldly desires needs to be destroyed so the inner spirit - the Jesus smell - can be released into the world. Even as the alabaster box of ointment that we read about in the New Testament had to be smashed for the fragrance to be enjoyed, our fleshly spirit and desires must smash so the fragrance of God's spirit can be experienced. Only then will people know that you are different; that you have been with Jesus.

Mom, your household will smell like you. You control the atmosphere of your home. People who walk into you home will feel that atmosphere. They will "smell" the scent of your home. If we, as mothers, manifest the fruit of the Spirit in our lives – love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance – we strongly influence our home and our children. Your children will follow your pattern of living. They will *smell* like you!

We live in a world of turmoil. We witness inhuman brutality, vicious hatred, and unbelievable violence – even within the home. While Jesus came to bring peace on earth, sin has turned our world into a war zone filled with evil, sadistic monsters. But, with the Lord, we can still have strong homes where the peace of God pervades and there is family happiness and joy. That makes a strong home because "the joy of the LORD is your strength" (Nehemiah 8:10).

We make our choices. Choose joy. Choose peace. Choose love. Choose God's way for the home. We cannot see the results of choices we make today that influence the tomorrows of those about us. Sarah knew God had promised Abraham he would be the father of a great nation. But, because God wasn't fulfilling His plan in her time frame, she took matters into her own hands and convinced her husband to bear seed of her

maid. From that day until today, the results of her action have caused death and destruction between two nations.

God told Rebekah that two nations were in her womb and the elder would serve the younger. Rather than allow God to work everything according to His wisdom, she influenced her son to lie, deceive, and manipulate his elderly father. Oh, yes, he received the blessing. However, it resulted in him being forced to flee for his life, and she never saw her son again – or his children, or his blessings.

How is your influence affecting your home and what legacy will you leave with your children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren? Look around you. Take a sniff... How do you smell?
